To provide up-to-date information on crops, technologies, and crop production related practices to growers and other members of the agricultural community.


The Partners

The Participants


- 116 in attendance with a total of 97,975 acres of cropland and 20,375 acres of small grains represented
- 87 farmers received pesticide credits
- 18 commercial applicators received pesticide credits, which preserved a total of \$131,868 in wages and saved \$720 in registration fees
- When asked if they had benefited from previous small grains field days, growers representing a total of 10,625 acres reported an average yield increase of 6.7 bushels per acre resulting in a total value of **\$569,855**
- Growers reported an average adoption rate of 59% based on all information provided at the field day
